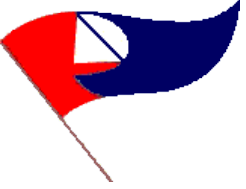

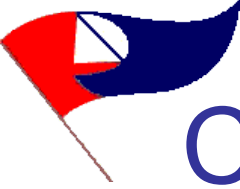

CSC – Overview and Description

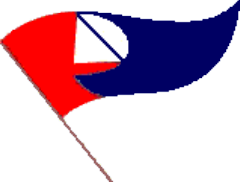
Overview

- Convair Sailing Club is a unique organization in the world of sailing clubs
- CSC is not a commercial business; it is a recreational club and a non-profit corporation
- Boats are owned by the members of the club and operated according to the club By-laws
- Costs of the Club are covered by an annual registration fee and a very low boat use fee
- The CSC has no paid employees or officers
- Club maintenance, administration & training is done by members on a volunteer basis
- Members earn sailing credit for their service to the club

Description

- CSC was originally part of General Dynamics (GD), Convair Recreation Association (CRA)
- When GD left San Diego, the members re-established the Club as a non-profit corporation
- Membership is now open to the general public

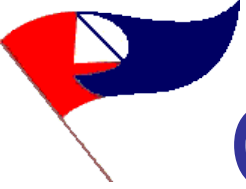

If you've ever watched the sailboats on San Diego Bay and wished you were on board enjoying the salt air breezes, Convair Sailing Club can make your dreams come true.

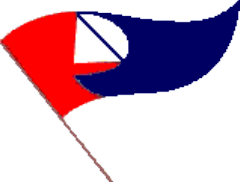

CSC – Events and Activities

- **General Meetings:** monthly gatherings with speakers or other informative programs
- **Orientation Sails:** on the Ensigns and Commander will be given to club members and anyone interested in joining our club
- **Racing Regattas:** monthly with 4 Fleets so everyone, at all levels, has an opportunity to win
- **Evening Regattas:** Monthly summer fun followed by a cookout around the pool
- **Racing Clinics:** Twice monthly seminars and practice sessions
- **Racing Practice:** Thursdays (bi-weekly), lunch on the dock after - no partner required
- **Super Sloopers:** “Just-for-fun” formation sailing bi-weekly, lunch on the dock after
- **Summer Picnic:** yearly summer social gathering
- **Holiday Dinner:** yearly winter social gathering



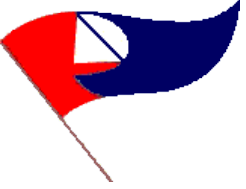

- One, 26 ft. Pearson Commander (not shown)





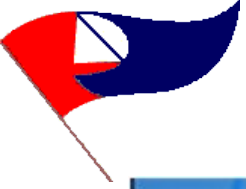
CSC – Why should I join?

- Lowest cost sailing venue in San Diego



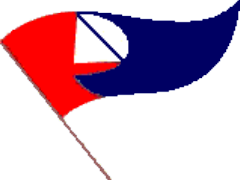

CSC members preparing for an evening regatta on the Ensigns



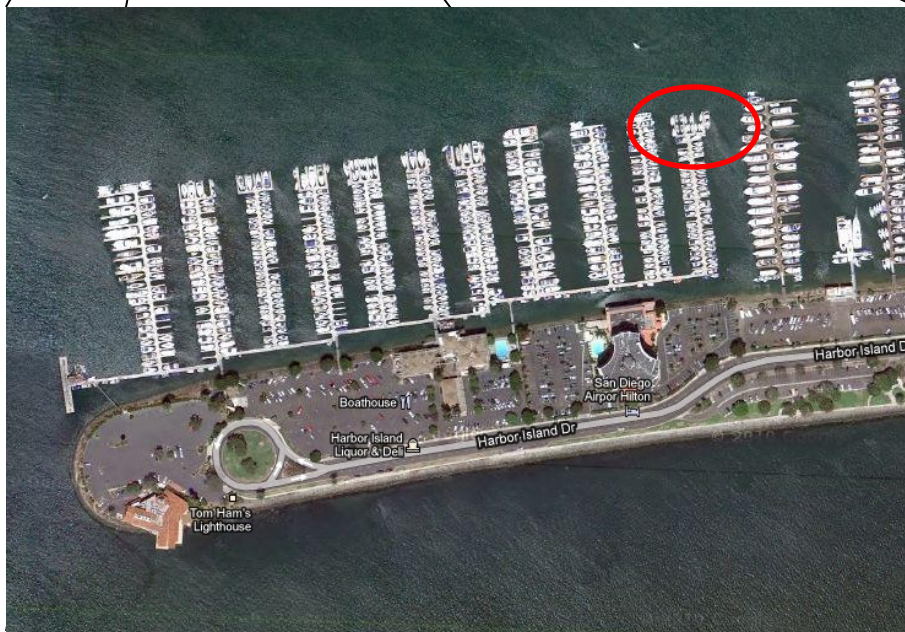
One of our Victories coming in for a landing

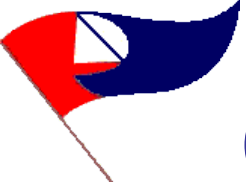


CSC – Where do I go?



- The CSC fleet is located in slips at the Harbor Island West Marina (HIWM), 2040 Harbor Island Drive San Diego, CA 92101
- Access to the Marina facilities is gained via key card access, issued to you upon check out

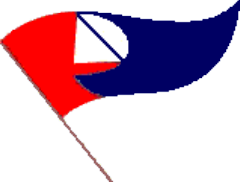




CSC Docks – Harbor Island

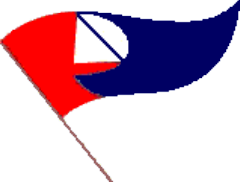
- The Marina provides
 - Parking
 - Restrooms with showers
 - Swimming pool and jacuzzi
 - Picnic tables
 - Lounge chairs
- Adjacent to the Marina are
 - The BoatHouse restaurant
 - Deli
 - Several yacht brokers
 - Other tenants





CSC – How do I join?

1. Go to the CSC website: <http://www.convair.org>
2. Download the application and wavier, fill them out completely and sign both
3. Bring the filled out and signed forms, along with your checkbook to Classroom 1 (See website for map)
4. Classroom 1 is on the first Monday of each month (except there are no classes in December)
5. Check in with the CSC Registrar, turn in your application/check and get your student membership card
6. **YOU ARE NOW A MEMBER!**
7. Attend all three classroom sessions and contact the Chief of Instruction to start your water sessions
8. Complete all 3 classroom sessions, take and pass the written exam
9. Attend at least 1 (or more) water sessions,
10. Once the Chief of Instruction gives the go ahead, you can then be checked out
11. Contact the Chief of Checkout to get checked out
12. Once you get checked out, you can now sail with the CSC
